Bushfire	Group caught in bushfire	WHS ENV	Med	Kimbriki Eco Staff <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Kimbriki staff will monitor weather • On days of Very High to Extreme fire danger excursions may be cancelled • In an emergency, students and teachers will move to the Emergency Assembly Point in the car park area. Kimbriki Emergency Wardens and Emergency services staff will take charge. <p>Visiting school</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School will phone Kimbriki prior to setting out for site on days of extreme weather • Teachers will bring a list of all those visiting the site – students, parents and teachers.

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Students alighting and boarding bus injury	Trip hazards, falls, etc	WHS	Low	<p>Visiting school</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students must be told to remain in the bus until instructed to get off at the Eco House and Garden • Students to be told the direction they are to go before they leave the bus • Students must be warned of vehicle traffic and plant movements on the site. <p>Kimbriki Eco Staff</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Eco Staff will meet the arriving bus and direct students and teachers.
Asthma and allergic reactions	Medical situations and possible medical emergencies	WHS	High	<p>Visiting school</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School staff must carry details of all students with known allergies • A parent or teacher must carry medications or treatments for students with known severe allergies.

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Allergies leading to severe reactions such as Anaphylaxis	Medical emergency	WHS	High	<p>Visiting school</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parent or teacher must carry details of any student with known severe allergic reactions • Parent or teacher supervising students with known severe allergies must carry a treatment plan for the student • Parent or teacher supervising students with known severe allergies must carry adequate medication • Supervising teacher must make the Eco staff aware of students at risk. Students susceptible to severe allergic reaction are not to taste plants they are not familiar with. <p>Kimbriki Eco Staff</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Kimbriki staff DO NOT administer medications
Sun exposure	Sunburn (long term skin damage) Heat stroke	WHS	Low	<p>Visiting school</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All students are required to wear adequate sun protection – eg. Hat, sunscreen, protective clothing • All visitors will bring adequate drinking water for the visit <p>Kimbriki Eco Staff</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Environmental conditions will be considered in the timing and selection of activities and rests

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Trips, and falls on uneven ground	Personal injury	WHS	Low	<p>Visiting school</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All students to wear shoes that cover the whole foot. • Teachers and/or parents to supervise students during the visit • Disabled students must have carer present during the visit <p>Kimbriki Eco Staff</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The primary task of the Eco Staff is to instruct – not supervision of students • Activities are chosen to suit abilities of the group • Staff will remove trip hazards as discovered • Paths will be regularly inspected
Snake and insect bite	Local pain and possible poisoning	WHS	Med	<p>Visiting school</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students must wear sturdy, enclosed shoes and stay within the Eco Garden <p>Kimbriki Eco Staff</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Snakes and other wildlife will be discussed during the induction • Eco staff are trained in First Aid • A stocked first aid kit is maintained in the Eco House • Local hospitals carry antivenin
